



WHY HUNT WITH KIOWA HUNTING SERVICE IN NEW MEXICO?

- New Mexico is renowned for its robust big game populations and the exceptional quality of its animals.
- Kiowa provides both private and public land hunting opportunities. Our private land hunts allow you to buy licenses over the counter, while public land licenses are obtained through application and draw.
- We offer various levels of guided public land hunts to suit your needs and budget. Enjoy fully guided hunts on a 1x1 or 2x1 basis, complete with accommodations and meals for five, seven, or nine days, depending on your weapon choice.
- For those looking for shorter options, we have two-day guided hunts with meals and accommodations available in units 10-12 or 51-52.
- Additionally, we offer a guided-only option for a minimum of two days in about 90% of New Mexico's remaining units, with or without accommodations. With either guided-only option, you can continue hunting the remainder of the season after your guided days end.
- Remember, the two-day guided Hunts must be on your first two hunting days. **WE ONLY PROVIDE THE TWO-DAY OPTION FOR ELK AND DEER HUNTS;** all other hunts are guided for the entire duration, whether less than five days or a minimum of five days. You can't legally hunt before the



- guided portion, but after your two days, you're free to hunt on your own.
- The license application process includes using our Outfitter Number, which can greatly enhance your chances of drawing a license.
- **WE DO NOT CHARGE FOR UTILIZING THE OUTFITTER NUMBER FOR YOUR LICENSE APPLICATION,** and you won't incur any fees until you successfully draw a license. However, once you draw a license using our outfitter number, you will need to pay for the hunt you choose. If you decide to hunt with a different outfitter after drawing your license and wish to transfer from us, there will be a fee for that as well.
 - Kiowa Hunting Service is licensed by all six National Forests, five Bureau of Land Management Districts, the State Land Office, and the White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico. We can facilitate public land hunts for any species throughout the state, offering you excellent options to apply for hunts across New Mexico. Many outfitters are limited to just one or two national forests or BLM districts, which restricts the variety of opportunities they provide.
 - With 38 years of experience, Kiowa has built strong professional relationships with landowners, federal agencies, and state authorities. We are fully licensed to operate in New Mexico and adhere to the regulations of the public lands where we hunt.

WHY HUNT WITH KIOWA HUNTING SERVICE IN COLORADO?

- Kiowa leases one of the premier elk hunting ranches in Colorado. The ranch is located within GMU 83 and is one of the few totally private land game units in the state.
- Kiowa's ranch provides you the opportunity to hunt for and take 300 B&C class bulls. This ranch consistently produces this quality of bull.
- Kiowa provides hunts on this ranch for archery and rifle.
- All Elk hunts, archery, or rifle, are by draw, requiring one
- Preference point to draw for sure, and we often draw with 0 points.
- The landowner has license vouchers and will sell them to you to allow for you to buy a license. The vouchers are strictly between you and the landowner.
- Kiowa offers you the opportunity to have a quality experience with use of the lodge, guides, catch and release fishing, and the opportunity to take that "big" bull that you have always thought about.

NEW MEXICO - GUIDED ONLY HUNTS WITH NO SERVICES

This hunting trip gives you the chance to apply for a PUBLIC LAND ELK OR DEER HUNT, using our outfitter number to boost your chances of getting a license. For the first two days of your hunt, we will provide a guide, which is required by Game and Fish regulations. If you prefer, you can also book a guided-only hunt for a duration of three to nine days, depending on your chosen weapon type. Unlike some other outfitters that only operate in a limited number of areas, you can apply in any unit you want with us. However, we steer clear of units that are primarily wilderness areas, like UNITS 45 AND 16B/22, as well as UNIT 6B, 18, and 50. While we do offer hunts in units 45 and 16B/22, we do not venture into the wilderness areas and do not provide packing services. Instead, we focus on the exterior regions of the Pecos Wilderness in unit 45 and hunt in unit 22 for 16B during your selected timeframe. Kiowa distinguishes itself from other outfitters because **WE DO NOT CHARGE FOR USING OUR OUTFITTER NUMBER** to enhance your drawing odds. Kiowa Hunting Service is licensed by ALL National Forests and all Bureau of Land Management Districts in the state,



as well as the State Land Office. For your hunt, we'll provide one guide for the first two days, which is **REQUIRED BY STATE LAW** when you use our outfitter number for your tag. This guide will assist all hunters who are part of a successful application. If you'd like to adjust your guide ratio from 4:1 or 2:1 to 2:1 or 1:1, we can arrange for an extra guide at an additional fee for all participants. Guided-only hunts are available on either a 1:1 or 2:1 basis. Please note that any request for additional guides or extra days must be made at the time of booking and can only be adjusted if there is staff available.



PARTIALLY GUIDED AND ACCOMMODATED HUNTS

PUBLIC LAND RIFLE, BOW, AND MUZZLELOADER

Partially Guided and Accommodated Hunts These hunts are available exclusively in Game Management Units 10, 12, 51, and 52 for all weapon types, including rifle, muzzleloader, and bow. They are geared towards hunters who seek a quality experience, feel confident hunting elk independently, desire partial guidance, and prefer not to handle the logistics of setting up and bringing a camp.

Here are some answers to frequently asked questions about our partially guided hunts:

- We operate one central base camp for units 10 and 12, as well as another for units 51 and 52, conveniently situated for easy access to both areas. We do not provide separate camps for individual groups.



- We do not transport people into specific areas for hunting.
- The number of individuals in camp varies based on the draw, so I can't provide a set figure.
- At the camps, Kiowa supplies a cook, meals, snacks, water, and soft drinks, along with a knowledgeable staff member to guide you to promising elk locations. We've got tents, cots, pads, shower facilities, lights, heat, and restrooms or porta-potties.

Hunters are responsible for:

- their own licenses, personal gear, bedrolls, weapons, and their transportation to and from camp, as well as during the hunt without a guide.

This hunt boasts a higher success rate than the two-day guided-only hunts, and the reason is straightforward: during the two-day hunts, we're only there for two days—providing minimal assistance. In the partially guided hunt with accommodations, you receive current insights about elk sightings and additional hunting areas, plus support with retrieval if staff is available. While you hunt, our team scouts for you, enabling you to be aware of where elk have recently been seen, which can significantly boost your success rate. Without knowledge of the area, after the first two days, you would be on your own.

Unit Descriptions: The units where we provide these services are as follows: Units 51 and 52 are located in North Central New Mexico. Unit 52 spans

approximately 300,000 acres, while Unit 51 covers around 380,000 acres. Both units fall within a roadless/wilderness area that restricts off-road vehicles and traffic. This is a public draw unit, and using our outfitter number typically increases your chances of drawing a license. The units where we provide these services are as follows: Units 51 and 52 are located in North Central New Mexico. Unit 52 spans approximately 300,000 acres, while Unit 51 covers around 380,000 acres. Both units fall within a roadless/wilderness area that restricts off-road vehicles and traffic.

This is a public draw unit, and using our outfitter number typically increases your chances of drawing a license.

Units 10 and 12: These areas encompass a mix of National Forest, Bureau of Land Management, New Mexico State Trust, and private lands. Located southwest of Grants, New Mexico, they are at the northern edge of the Gila range. I consider Unit 10 a hidden gem. Though it has fewer elk, the quality of the bulls here can lead to exceptional trophies. The unit's diverse landscape, which includes Native American reservations, national monuments, and private holdings, allows many bulls the chance to mature and grow in size. We've harvested bulls exceeding 300 B&C, with the occasional one surpassing 350 B&C.



GUIDED ELK HUNTS - FULLY ACCOMMODATED

CARSON NATIONAL FOREST

Accommodated Units 51 and 52 are our primary hunting areas in the Carson National Forest, but we also offer hunts in all other units within the forest, including units 2, 49, 53, and the Valle Vidal in unit 55A.

We accommodate all weapon types: rifle, muzzleloader, and archery. The units within the Carson are expansive, ranging from 100,000 to nearly 400,000 acres, providing a variety of terrains from timberline to sagebrush flats, allowing hunters to choose an area that best fits their skills and physical limitations.

Most of these units have motor vehicle restrictions, meaning off-road and minimal road traffic is permitted. For a detailed description of units 51 and 52, please refer to the previous page. These units offer hunters easy access, a robust elk population, and limited hunting pressure. As a public draw unit, they generally provide good chances of drawing a license when using our outfitter number.

- **The cost of the hunt includes:** access to the Outfitter Number for license drawing, the appropriate number of guides, camp accommodations, meals, courtesy transportation during the hunt, and assistance with game retrieval and capping for trophy preparation.
- **Hunters are responsible for:** applying for their license (with our support), bringing their personal items including a bedroll and weapon, arranging any motel accommodations outside of our camp, and handling their personal gear and transportation to and from camp as well as to the hunting areas.



We offer archery, muzzleloader, and rifle hunts in the Lincoln units, renowned for producing big bulls and boasting impressive numbers. Our guides in these areas are highly experienced, knowledgeable, and dedicated hunters, with a proven track record of helping clients secure trophy bulls. The Lincoln units are exceptional, making them extremely popular and highly sought after by sportsmen. Because of their high demand, drawing a tag can be quite challenging; however, it's definitely worth including these units as one of your three choices on your application.



These units have some of the best bull-to-cow ratios in the state, significantly improving your chances of drawing a tag compared to the Gila Units. Game Management Unit 36 is the easiest to draw among the Lincoln units, featuring the state's highest bull-to-cow ratio at an impressive 71:100, according to Game and Fish. This presents a perfect opportunity for you to draw a tag and enjoy a guided hunt for just the cost of the landowner tag. It's essential to make this one of your three choices when applying.

In the Lincoln units, we exclusively offer fully guided hunts with accommodations or guided-only options without accommodations or meals for a minimum of two days up to the length of the season.

These are the bulls that you hear legends about. In the past, the Kiowa team has successfully taken bulls as large as 383, with many of our hunters often bringing home bulls in the 340 to 350 class. Everyone has their sights set on hunting the Gila, and while there are great opportunities there, keep in mind that if you're applying for these tags, use one choice instead of three, as the chances of drawing a Gila tag are about 5% or less. Not all Gila units are the same; some units and hunts are definitely easier to draw than others. To find out which units are more accessible, give us a call, and we can discuss the best options. If you draw, you're in for a fantastic hunt with exceptional guides and remarkable bulls. However, it's wise to consider additional options for your application as well.

- In the Gila units, we only offer fully guided and accommodated hunts or two-day minimum guided hunts up to guide only for the whole season, without accommodations or meals.
- The cost of the hunt includes: camp accommodations (if utilized), meals, courtesy transportation during the hunt, assistance with retrieving your harvested animal, and help with capping and preparing your trophy.

• Hunters are responsible for: applying for the license (with our assistance), arranging motel accommodations or any lodging outside of our camp, and providing their personal gear.

BE CAREFUL, the Gila National Forest put a moratorium on new outfitters this year and if your outfitter did not have one this past year he will not have one for five years or longer.

🦌🦌 CIBOLA NATIONAL FOREST - UNITS 10 AND 12 🦌🦌



These units are well-known for their impressive bulls and a solid number of elk. While the overall elk population may not be as high as in other units, the size of these units, along with the presence of national monuments, closed areas, and private land, allow bulls to mature and grow in size. Our guides in these areas are highly knowledgeable hunters with a proven track record of helping clients harvest bulls.

We've been hunting this unit for over 14 years, and our original crew is still on board today. These guides not only work in the area; they also live and play there, giving them an intimate knowledge of the landscape. Taking bulls of up to 340 B&C, as we did this year, is not uncommon, as we have consistently harvested high-quality bulls over the years. The key to our success lies in the guides' extensive familiarity with the area, their year-round scouting, and their deep understanding of the elk herd's habits, including the secret spots where they like to retreat.

This area is at a lower elevation compared to other units, featuring easier terrain and a well-maintained network of roads for convenient access throughout. Our camp is stationed on private property, offering straightforward access to most of the unit. Located at the southern end of unit 10, this camp also serves as a base for hunts in unit 12. The unit follows standard dates for archery hunts but only allows one muzzleloader and one rifle hunt each season, which contributes to the impressive growth of the elk population here.

We offer four types of hunts in the Cibola: a guided-only hunt with no accommodations or meals for a minimum of two days, a two-day guided hunt without accommodations, a two-day guided hunt with accommodations and meals, and a fully guided hunt that includes accommodations and meals for five, seven, or nine days.

The cost of the hunt includes: access to the Outfitter Number for license drawing, the appropriate number of guides, camp accommodations, meals, courtesy transportation during the hunt, assistance with game retrieval, and capping for trophy preparation.

Hunters are responsible for: applying for the license (with our assistance), bringing their personal items such as a bedroll and weapon, arranging for any motel accommodations outside our camp, and providing their personal gear.

The Santa Fe National Forest is centrally located in the state, encompassing parts or all of units 5B, 6A, 6C, 43, and 45. Spanning 1.6 million acres, the forest features elevations ranging from 5,000

feet to 13,000 feet. Within this area, unit 6B, known as the Valles Caldera, stands out as a National Preserve, distinct in its own right and surrounded by the Santa Fe National Forest. The forest also borders the Jicarilla Apache Reservation, where some impressive animals can be found. Currently, we do not operate within the wilderness of unit 45; although we are licensed to hunt there, we've chosen to focus on the surrounding areas due to logistical considerations.

We have successfully hunted in the Santa Fe National Forest, utilizing our experienced team to offer either guided-only hunts (minimum of two days) or fully guided hunts if that's what you prefer. Some units within the Santa Fe are easier to draw than others, providing solid opportunities for securing an elk hunt. The elk population in these units is healthy, and we've seen good success in pursuing them.

We offer two types of hunts in the Santa Fe: guided-only hunts with a two-day

🦌🦌 PRIVATE LAND (GUARANTEED LICENSES) - BULL ELK RIFLE 🦌🦌

These are Guaranteed License hunts that take place on private ranches in New Mexico and Colorado, all of which are capable of producing 300 B&C class bulls for hunters. The hunts commence in early September with archery sessions and transition to rifle and muzzleloader hunts in early October to capitalize on the rut and the bugling of the bulls. You'll be hunting in areas where we have confirmed elk presence, ensuring a high percentage of opportunity for trophy harvest. These are Guaranteed License hunts that take place on private ranches in New Mexico and Colorado, all of which are capable of producing 300 B&C class bulls for hunters. The hunts commence in early September with archery sessions and transition to rifle and muzzleloader hunts in early October to capitalize on the rut and the bugling of the bulls. You'll be hunting in areas where we have confirmed elk presence, ensuring a high percentage of opportunity for trophy harvest.

Each private ranch varies in terrain, elk population, number of hunters per hunt, accommodations, and other factors. While these hunts are not extremely physically demanding, they can require a reasonable level of fitness. Elk hunting can be challenging, so it's advisable to be prepared for some physical effort. You don't need to be an elite athlete, but if you struggle to walk any distance without needing to stop, you may find it difficult to successfully pursue a bull, and it could result in wasted resources. Feel free to call us, and we can discuss your options and match you with a ranch that aligns with the

type of hunt you are seeking.

The cost of the hunt includes:

- In New Mexico: Landowner authorization enabling you to purchase a hunting license, the necessary number of guides, camp accommodations, meals and snacks, courtesy transportation during the hunt, and assistance with game retrieval and trophy capping.
- In Colorado: The appropriate number of guides, camp accommodations, meals and snacks, courtesy transportation during the hunt, and help with game retrieval and trophy capping.

The hunter is responsible for:

- **In New Mexico:** Purchasing a valid hunting license using the supplied landowner authorization number from any vendor in the state.
- **In Colorado:** Obtaining a valid license by completing the application and drawing process for Colorado. If you fail to draw a license, you will need to reach out to the landowner to buy a voucher to use for a hunting license purchase.
- **In Both States:** The hunter is also responsible for bringing personal items, including alcohol, weapon, and ammunition, as well as any specific items that may be needed. Additionally, motel accommodations or any lodging outside of our camp will be the hunter's responsibility, along with arranging transportation from home to camp or a prearranged meeting location.

This ranch is located west of Grants, New Mexico, just off the I-40 interstate corridor, providing convenient access. Situated at an elevation of approximately 6,800 feet, the terrain consists of rolling hills and mesa landscapes. We have been hunting this ranch for the past seven years and have maintained an impressive success rate of over 90% for rifle bull elk hunts.

The hunt is not overly strenuous; it primarily involves spending time glassing for elk, identifying potential targets, and then maneuvering into the right position for a shot. It's important to be prepared to move and cover some distance, as the hunt is conducted entirely on foot. This ranch is very lightly hunted, which contributes to the high success rate. Exceptional bulls are found here, with past hunts yielding bulls as large as 370 B&C. The average bull taken is above 300 B&C, and due to the limited number of hunters permitted, each hunter has ample time to search for the bull that meets their criteria.

COLORADO PRIVATE LAND ELK HUNT

This hunt takes place in Southeastern Colorado, specifically in Game Management Unit 83. It's an exceptional opportunity for a once-in-a-lifetime harvest, with the potential to secure a trophy-class bull exceeding 300 B&C. Although this hunt is relatively easier compared to others, it remains an elk hunt, which means you'll need to be prepared to get out and actively hunt.

You'll be hunting at elevations ranging from 7,500 to 10,000 feet, with the lodge situated at 9,500 feet. As such, the better your physical condition, the greater your chances of success. This isn't about leisurely rides in a vehicle while searching for elk; your days will begin and end with walking, covering multiple miles each outing. It's structured as a morning and evening hunt rather than an all-day trek.

In a typical weather year, this area often hosts a significant number of bulls. The hunting area spans over 11,000 acres and includes diverse terrains, from sagebrush flats and wetlands to alfalfa fields and timberline regions. We will conduct hunts on this ranch during the last archery season as well as all four rifle hunts.

All archery and rifle hunts are by draw, with the application window for Colorado closing around April 7th, 2026. In 2025, we experienced a 76% draw rate for the rifle hunts, and we anticipate a similar success rate for the new archery tag applications this year.

If you do not draw a license, you will have the option to purchase a license voucher from the rancher, allowing you to buy a license over the counter.

If a youth hunter draws a tag, they will only need to pay for the license itself, alleviating any upfront costs on your credit card for the application and license fees. By combining this opportunity with the free use of the outfitter number from Kiowa Hunting, it creates a win/win situation. We encourage you to think seriously about this opportunity. There are several application services available that can help offset the costs of the license and state application fee while offering free application services specifically for youth

hunters. If a youth hunter draws a tag, they will only need to pay for the license itself, alleviating any upfront costs on your credit card for the application and license fees. By combining this opportunity with the free use of the outfitter number from Kiowa Hunting, it creates a win/win situation. We encourage you to think seriously about this opportunity and join us for an unforgettable hunting experience.

Moreover, if you have a youth hunter who successfully draws a tag, Kiowa suggests accompanying them on the hunt. Sharing this experience and making it a family event is invaluable. We do not charge a non-hunting fee for family members who accompany the youth hunter, and we

genuinely encourage family involvement.

New Mexico also offers special hunt dates for youth hunters across various species, including Bighorn sheep, elk, deer, and antelope. These youth hunts take place during prime times in prime locations, making them exceptional opportunities. Youth hunters can apply for different



hunts, but these specific hunts are particularly enticing due to the quality of the offerings. To qualify for New Mexico's youth hunts, a hunter must be 17 years of age or younger on the opening date of the hunt and must possess a valid hunter education number or mentor-youth number, which applies to all species except for sheep and elk.

Additionally, we haven't forgotten about senior citizens! New Mexico offers an off-range Oryx hunt designed for seniors aged 70 years and older. This hunt is typically less physically demanding and is specifically reserved for those who qualify based on age. It's a sought-after opportunity, so if you meet the age requirement, it's worth considering.

Despite our busy schedule in the fall, we occasionally take the opportunity to hunt with other outfitters in different states. We often receive inquiries about outfitters to recommend, and we only endorse those we have personally hunted with. While we know many outfitters, we don't simply visit their camps or know the intricacies of their operations, which means we cannot offer honest recommendations for them. As a service to our customers, here are three outfitters we have hunted with, have visited in their camps, and are familiar with how they operate. We feel confident in recommending them if you're looking to hunt in Colorado, Arizona, or Mexico. It's worth noting that these three states have different licensing procedures:

New Mexico: Operates on a strict lottery system with no preference or bonus points. If you enter, you're simply in the draw.

Colorado: Uses a preference point system. If you do not have enough points, you will not be eligible to draw.

Arizona: Implements a bonus point system, allowing you to accumulate bonus points for each year you apply. Remarkably, you can still draw a tag even if you have no points.

Mexico: Offers licenses that can be purchased over the counter, and the outfitter will arrange this process for you. This overview simplifies the draw processes in these states, but each has its specificities that you'll want to consider as you plan your hunting adventures.




Arizona utilizes a bonus points system, which means you can potentially draw a hunt even with 0 bonus points. While the odds may be against you, it does happen every year. 

There are places in the United States that I feel worse about being than in Mexico. The deer in Mexico are nothing like what you will experience in most locations in the United States. A 160 B&C to 180 B&C mule deer is just a deer and a Coues deer that is 100 B&C in Mexico is just a deer. When we want to hunt for excellent Mule Deer and Coues Deer we normally go south into Mexico. We have been there numerous years and have never felt insecure or in any compromising position. There are places in the United States that I feel worse about being

than in Mexico. The deer in Mexico are nothing like what you will experience in most locations in the United States. A 160 B&C to 180 B&C mule deer is just a deer and a Coues deer that is 100 B&C in Mexico is just a deer.

The hunting for Mule deer is mostly done out of a high rack vehicle and the Coues deer is by Spot and Stalk and sitting on Water holes. When you decide to go to Mexico the outfitter will take care of all your paperwork for you from gun permits, licenses, export permits and pick you up at the airport in Hermosillo, Mexico. You are well taken care of in Mexico and will lack for nothing that you will need. The quality animals are there, the accommodations are very nice and the personnel will see that you do not want for anything.

OUTFITTER RAMBLINGS

The interesting part of this business is the people that you meet, visit with, talk with, and the situations that occur or could be prevented if things were handled differently. With this in mind, these are my thoughts on various subjects and hopefully, they will assist you in planning your hunt.

The Application System for Public Land Hunts

The first step in the application system is to be honest with yourself about what you desire in a hunt. If you only want a huge bull or buck, say so. But if you want to hunt elk and don't care on the size of the bull or buck, say so. There are no hidden gems and little spots in New Mexico that are easy to draw, have large animals, low hunter pressure and have high success rates. The units that have more and bigger animals are in high demand and your odds of drawing are low with some areas giving less than 1% draw odds. Some units have a high draw rate, but that's because there are a limited number of elk or deer, low harvest success rates, and usually have high hunter numbers. Hunters take some animals in these areas, but your hunt can be deemed successful if you simply see a legal animal.

So, you have three choices, and all are valid. When they pull your application they will look at all three choices at the same time and the first one, in the order that you put them, that has licenses is where you go. You'll want to try for a high demand, big bull unit as your first choice, then go with higher percentage draws. Utilize your three options on the draw.

Outfitters are businessmen and most are very honest and truthful in what they do though some are not. As stated, before, be honest. Just as you expect the outfitter to be honest, the outfitter expects you to do the same and explain what you are looking for. Elk hunts are difficult so do not fool yourself that they are easy. The better prepared you are, the better your chances will be. Some bulls die by road hunters and simple plans, but elk are tough and smart. Lower success rates than other species is common as they are elusive and you are not going to see herds where you can pick and choose your elk. If elk hunting WAS easy no one would do it, hence the demand for them. Outfitters are businessmen and most are very honest and truthful in what they do though some are not. The best way to ensure you will not kill an animal

This is pretty simple: just insult your guide, degrade your guide, explain that you have hunted several times and know more than the guide, tell them that in some other state this is how we hunt, and overall make your guide not want to hunt with you. These guys know what to do and should be regarded with respect. They are very good at what they do and are going to try to get you an animal, whether a two-day guided or fully guided.

DO you harvest animals in the first two days of guide only hunts

Yes, we do this very often during the seasons. The guides are there to hunt and to take animals during their time with you. The guides try hard and we try to send the best guides with you to get an animal.

If I am unsuccessful the first two days of the hunt can I hire the guide for additional days?

Possibly, but there are several items that must occur. First is that a new contract must be prepared for the Game and Fish Department. Secondly, a new itinerary must be prepared for the Forest Service or the Bureau of Land Management and lastly someone needs to be around to prepare these documents. We also do not do increase your guides by the day. If you want a guide for extra days then you need to decide on how many days and we do it once.

What are the accommodations like on the hunts?

In our Elk Camp units, 10-12 and 51-52 we utilize tent camps with a house or cabin for the cooking. In most of the

other units that we hunt, for other species and in some deer and elk hunts, we will attempt to utilize motels in towns centrally located to the hunt areas. The hunter will be responsible for his own motel accommodations on these hunts, and we will furnish meals. We also offer guide only hunts for most species, where the hunter is responsible for his own meals and accommodations. Every hunt is a little different so there is no set normal operation for all hunts

What is the best way to never hunt with Kiowa Hunting more than once?

The best way to do a "one and done" with Kiowa is do not tip your guide. If you do not want to ever come back just do not tip the guide. The guides are contract employees and work at their own discretion, they are not employees that can be forced to work in certain manners. Guides also talk to other guides, and they talk about tips and hunters. If you do not tip the guide, they will tell all the other guides, so, when you want to rebook, I will not be able to find anybody that will guide you.

Why do you not guide and hunt in wilderness areas on two-day hunts?

This is simple, we can do it if you want to pay. To do two-day wilderness hunts the guide must pack in to the wilderness the day before the two days hunting and pack out of the wilderness the day after the two days of hunting, for a total of four days. Real simple you pay for two days of the guides time at booking and if you want four days, to do a wilderness hunt, then you will be charged for four days. This is simple, we can do it if you want to pay. To do two-

day wilderness hunts the guide must pack in to the wilderness the day before the two days hunting and pack out of the wilderness the day after the two days of hunting, for a total of four days. Real simple you pay for two days of the guides time at booking and if you want four days, to do a wilderness hunt, then you will be charged for four days.

Up and coming Elk Units

One of the up-and-coming units that have come to our attention is unit 2 for elk. The staff is seeing lots of elk and good bulls. We hunted archery there this year and the guide had numerous opportunities on elk, shot at four different elk in seven days and wounded one that was not recovered. A serious unit to consider for this year.

Closing a loophole

It has come to our attention about a couple of recurring items that we witnessed last year. Because numerous outfitters are starting to charge for the use of their outfitter number to apply and we are not charging, we feel that we had several clients use our number to draw a tag and then immediately requested a transfer to another outfitter. We believe that they did this with no intention of hunting with us but to avoid paying the desired outfitter for the use of his number. We are instituting a policy now, that if you use our number to apply and draw a license if you want to transfer from us to another outfitter, we are charging for the transfer.

ANTELOPE

We are once again offering public land rifle antelope hunts in New Mexico, which features many outstanding antelope units. These hunts will primarily be "guided only" and will take place over the entire three days of the rifle season or the first three days of your archery hunt. We will utilize the outfitter number to assist you in drawing the necessary license.

Once you draw the license, it will be valid for any public land within the designated unit, provided there is legal access. It's important to note that, due to New Mexico's permit allocation system, a minimum of 7 total licenses must be available for that hunt in order for you to be in the draw using our outfitter number.

The more applicants included on the application, the more available licenses will need to be present for that specific unit. Typically, each unit has three season dates, with the last one being the easiest to draw; however, the odds of harvesting a quality animal tend to be lower during that time. You have the flexibility to mix and match units and season dates when you submit your application.



Kiowa Hunting Service offers hunts for free-ranging Oryx (Gemsbok) on both the White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) and the McGregor Range. We are one of the few licensed outfitters authorized to operate on both ranges and have been involved with WSMR since outfitters were first legally permitted.



Both the WSMR and McGregor Range hunts are considered public land hunts, with licenses allocated by a draw system. Numerous hunts will be available for application on WSMR starting in September 2026 and continuing through February 2027.



WSMR Hunts: These are 3-day hunts and are considered once-in-a-lifetime opportunities. If you have previously hunted on WSMR, you will need to apply for the broken horn hunt or consider an off-range hunt as an alternative.

McGregor Range Hunts: These are 2-day hunts and not limited to a once-in-a-lifetime

draw, so you can apply again even if you have previously hunted on WSMR.

ORYX PUBLIC LAND - OFF RANGE HUNTS

We will be conducting off-range hunts throughout the year. These hunts allow you to explore public land for an entire month, providing greater flexibility. We will guide you for five days, offering only the No-Frills package described above.

During the hunt, we will determine the area to focus our efforts, and on most hunts, you will have additional personnel available to scout and locate Oryx for you. While the population off-range does not compare to that of the on-range hunts, the odds of drawing a permit are generally good.

Last year, the success rate for off-range hunts was 60%, leading the Department to increase the number of licenses issued by 18% for this year. If you're interested in taking an Oryx, it's advisable to apply for one of these hunts as a second or third choice.

The key differences between the on-range and off-range hunts are straightforward:

On-Range Hunts: These offer a high success rate (86%) and allow you to be selective in your choice.

Off-Range Hunts: Here, you will need to act quickly if you spot an Oryx that meets your criteria since the success rate is lower and the population is not as robust.

The average number of days hunted off-range was around 5.5 days per hunter, providing a solid opportunity to pursue Oryx while opening up more options for your hunting experience, including the McGregor Range hunts. If you're looking for an adventurous experience with less competition for permits, this could be a great option for you.

Bighorn Sheep Application Information You can apply for both Rocky Mountain Sheep and Desert Sheep on the same application, which allows you to maximize your opportunities for drawing a license. For each hunt code (one for Rocky Mountain and one for Desert), you are allowed to select three hunt

areas, each associated with specific hunt dates.

When the Game and Fish Department reviews applications, they will look at each hunt code and area in the order you ranked them. Essentially, they evaluate all your choices simultaneously, and the first available hunt code and area that has an opening is the

license you will draw.

To enhance your chances of success, it's crucial to utilize all six opportunities (three for Rocky Mountain Sheep and three for Desert Sheep) on your application. By carefully selecting your preferred hunt areas and being strategic in your choices, you can significantly improve your odds of drawing a permit.

When considering sheep hunting in New Mexico, it's essential to plan ahead, understand the specific requirements associated with each species, and prepare for a hunt that can be both challenging and rewarding. High-quality sheep hunts are a fantastic opportunity, and with the right approach, you can make the most of your application.

Mexico's desert bighorn sheep population is thriving, with sheep found in five different units. The Department offers 13 distinct hunts for you to select from, and we can

We offer hunts for Rocky Mountain Sheep in all available units except for Unit 45 (Pecos). We do not operate in Unit 45 due to the logistical challenges associated with properly conducting a horseback hunt, as the main population of sheep resides in a wilderness area that requires a lengthy ride to access.

Rocky Mountain Sheep hunts take place across 12 different units, with the Department providing 15 various hunts for you to choose from. Once you draw your license, you will be met by a dedicated team the day before your hunt begins to assist you with preparation and logistics.

Depending on the unit you've drawn, your hunt may involve horseback, backpacking, or truck access. We encourage you to reach out to us for details about the different hunts available, and we will work to match you with a hunt that fits your preferences and goals.

These hunts generally take place from August through November, varying by the specific unit drawn. We're here to ensure you have a successful and enjoyable hunting experience, so don't hesitate to contact us for more information or to plan your adventure!



IBEX



Ibex New Mexico's Florida Mountains are unique, being the only location in the Western Hemisphere where pure, unfenced, free-ranging Persian (Bezoar) Ibex can be hunted. Our team, including many former Kauffman Outfitters

personnel, brings over 2,000 man-days of Ibex hunting experience to the table, utilizing strategies that consider factors such as hunter density, hunt type (muzzleloader, rifle, or bow), wind conditions, seasonal vegetation changes, precipitation, cougar signs, and the experience level of our hunters. We accommodate a wide range of hunters from youth to those with physical limitations, with youth hunts scheduled during the school Christmas break. New Mexico's Florida Mountains are unique, being the only location in the Western Hemisphere where pure, unfenced, free-ranging Persian (Bezoar) Ibex can be hunted. Our team, including many former Kauffman Outfitters personnel, brings over 2,000 man-days of Ibex hunting experience to the table, utilizing strategies that consider factors such as hunter density, hunt type (muzzleloader, rifle, or bow), wind conditions, seasonal vegetation changes, precipitation, cougar signs, and the experience level of our hunters. We accommodate a wide range of hunters from youth to those with physical limitations, with youth hunts scheduled during the school Christmas break.

Notably, Safari Club International (SCI) maintains trophy statistics for Ibex, and their record book shows that the highest scoring Bow and Muzzleloader harvests and the second highest scoring Rifle harvest were established in New Mexico. We have guided five of the top six bow harvests in the state, achieving 87% of guided bow harvests and 54% of all bow harvests (both guided and unguided). Only 9% of entries in the record book are attributed to other outfitters still in business, emphasizing why many choose to hunt with Kiowa.

With Kiowa, you have the opportunity to take multiple Ibex

with a bow before drawing a rifle tag. Contrary to rumors, short bow shots are indeed feasible for Billy Ibex.

Drawing Details

Applying with the Kiowa Outfitter number, available on our website, significantly enhances your odds of drawing a permit. Currently, the Ibex population is low compared to previous years, prompting the Department to decrease the number of licenses issued, shorten the Muzzleloader hunt from fifteen days to seven days, and ban scopes on muzzleloaders.

Drawing a bow Ibex license tends to be easier than obtaining a firearm license. For many bow hunters, the January hunt is more convenient than the October option, and outfitted January bow hunt odds are more than twice as high compared to non-resident hunts, while outfitted October bow hunt odds are over six times higher.

PUBLIC LAND BARBARY SHEEP (Aoudad)



This hunt is for free-ranging Barbary Sheep (Aoudad) in New Mexico, known for providing excellent opportunities for high-quality animals. The hunt adopts a “park the vehicle and hike” style, meaning once you begin, the vehicle will not be seen again until dark. This is a physically demanding hunt with a considerable amount of walking each day.

Recent Changes

The hunt units consist of multiple big game units combined, and we can hunt in all of the following units: Unit 28 McGregor Range, Units 29 and 30, and Units 32, 36, and 37.



Each of these units offers multiple hunt dates, and you can mix and match units on your application, all of which will be valid for the draw.

Hunt Units Overview

McGregor Range (Unit 28): This area is likely the best for drawing a sheep tag with less

hunting pressure, as it has limited Ram hunts occurring here. The department is currently managing the ewe herd to reduce sheep numbers in the region

- **Units 32, 36, and 37:** Be prepared for long hikes over rolling mountain terrain and extensive pack-outs.
- **Units 29 and 30:** Expect a lot of glassing, long hikes, and the need to climb to reach the sheep.
- **Unit 28:** Offers good access from multiple roads. However,

once sheep are sighted, you may face a long hike to reach them.



Cost of the Hunt Includes:

- Courtesy transportation during the hunt.
- Drinks, snacks, and lunches throughout the hunt.
- Accommodations and meals can be provided if you camp out, which is common in Units 29-30. You have the option to bring your own camp and meals, or if you prefer, we can set it up for you at an additional cost.

- Arranging travel to the designated city we choose to operate out of for the hunt or a previously agreed meeting location.
- Motel accommodations if not camping, or camp accommodations if no city is nearby.

Public land licenses are allocated by draw, and utilizing an outfitter number offers the best chance of success across the three drawing pools.
